NALC's Management Board met on 26 January. Councillors considered the Local Government Association (LGA) model code of conduct and agreed, subject to feedback from county officers, to recommend to National Assembly on 9 March that it be adopted by local councils and replace the NALC code. They stressed that this needed to be part of a wider project on civility aimed at improving standards and behaviours, and agreed on the need to dedicate resources and work closely with the Society of Local Council Clerks.

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Agenda Item 8

Climate Change Report

Witham Town Council would declare a Climate Change Emergency and, in doing, so, commits to working towards a reduction in carbon emissions by 2030.

To do this we need to:

Develop and deliver a Town Climate Strategy, working with various other organisations and other councils. A working group should be formed to report within a designated timescale on immediate and longer term actions to be taken. Part of this plan would be to engage with a wide cross section of the community.

Plan to include:

a) Deliver a report on what we are already doing towards reducing the impact of the climate crisis. In fact we have made a very good start but it has never been collated and talked about as climate change methods because we already have succeeded in:

- 1. Changing our street lamps to LED
- 2. Work with the Tree Group on planting trees
- 3. Planted James Cook Wood many years ago. (?)
- 4. Provide and manage Allotments (from May 2021)
- 5. We are also looking at cycle way provision throughout the town.
- 6. Provision of Whetmead Nature Reserve.

b) Research and produce a data base of information of products and grants available for climate emergency projects.

c) Deliver a climate crisis public engagement programme,

d) Urge all public sector organisations (taxi) in Witham to commit to at least 30% of their fleet using non-fossil fuel by 2030

d) Commit the Council to reduce their carbon footprint by 2030.

The first step would be to arrange for a consultation on the Town Hall to find how carbon efficient it is and how that can be reduced.

e) Train town leaders, councillors and council staff in a climate crisis programme to enable them to respond to the climate emergency in everything they do.

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
