


FAREWELL FROM THE PREVIOUS MAYOR

ANNUAL TOWN MEETING



On Monday 8th April 2024 Witham Town Council held its Annual Town Meeting focusing on youth engagement at the Royal British Legion Hall in Witham.

Members of local community organisations were invited to talk and presentations were received from Action for Family Carers, Witham BB, Witham Carnival Association, The Witham Hub, 295 (Witham & Rivenhall) Squadron ATC and Cllr Phil Barlow on behalf of Templars Residents Association.

Representatives from Essex Police also attended to provide an update and answer any questions.

Members of the public were encouraged to attend.

ST PETER'S CLOSURE CONSULTATION

Witham Town Council held a public consultation at New Rickstones Academy on Monday 11th March 2024 to ensure Witham had its say regarding the proposed closure of St Peter's Hospital in Maldon and to demonstrate the Town Council's and resident's concerns.

NEPP PARKING CHARGES



The North Essex Parking Partnership (NEPP) announced that IT intended to convert current free parking spaces in Newland Street to paid ones, which Witham Town Council took action in actively opposing.

As well as writing to the Braintree District Council Financial Scrutiny Panel querying its agreement with the North Essex Parking Partnership, having heard residents concerns, the Town Council launched an online and physical petition which, combined, generated nearly 2000 signatures.

S106 FUNDING



Witham Town Council are committed to enhancing our open spaces and are responsible for the River Walk, Whetmead Nature Reserve and James Cooke Wood in the town. Other public open spaces in Witham come under the management of Braintree District Council, Eastlight Homes or individual management companies. Recently, thanks to Section 106 developer funding, Witham Town Council have been able to carry out some exciting projects to enhance our public green spaces. We have installed a beautiful boardwalk at James Cooke Wood to improve accessibility, created a beefriendly planting area on the River Walk and installed new steps, an interpretation board and a fun, interactive children's nature trail at Whetmead Nature Reserve. More information about these projects can be found on pages 10 and 11.

Section 106 funds are contributions paid to the local planning authority, Braintree District Council, by building companies when a new housing or commercial development is agreed. This allows local authorities to enter into agreements with developers to secure contributions to help offset the impact of new developments. It's important to note that Section 106 funds are designated for specific purposes and cannot be used for other projects outside the agreement's scope.

We will be continuing to use Section 106 funds for further enhancements to our open spaces and are currently considering making improvements to some of the paths on the River Walk and the car park at James Cooke Wood but would value your input with what you would like to see. Witham Town Council can only carry out open space improvements on our own land, so the River Walk, Whetmead or James Cooke Wood. Please note that these funds are specifically allocated for open space projects so cannot be used for other community needs like potholes or healthcare.

If you have ideas for open space improvements outside of Witham Town Council's authority, these can also be taken into consideration and passed on to Braintree District Council to be included in the Potential Open Space Improvements document for the future. The full document can be found here-

BANK REINFORCEMENT

Our Operations team have been busy at Whetmead Nature Reserve working on a part of the river bank which has been eroding. The area has been filled with sand bags to protect the remaining bank andfinished with top soil.



BEE FRIENDLY PLANTING AREA

Witham Town Council, in partnership with The Bee Friendly Trust, has created a bee garden on the edge of the River Walk near River View. The haven includes bird boxes, 3 bee hotels for solitary bees, rosemary bushes, olive trees, skimmia, euphorbia, cytisus ivy, verbena, cornflower, sunflower seeds and geraniums together with an information board of bee facts. This beautiful area with its proximity to the river makes it a perfect spot for bees.

This exciting project has been funded with developer Section 106 money from Braintree District Council which was specifically allocated for landscaping in this area. It is designed to provide much needed support for nature, in particular bees whose populations have been in decline worldwide as a result of habitat loss, pesticide usage and climate

JAMES COOKE WOOD BOARDWALK

Witham Town Council is thrilled to announce the completion of a boardwalk installation in James Cooke Wood. Located on the edge of Witham off Maldon Road (What3Words:allow-line-that), James Cooke Wood is a cherished natural asset which Witham Town Council created when they purchased the land back in 1993 and subsequently planted 6,000 trees forming the community woodland.

The new boardwalk, funded by \$106 developer funds, has been installed in a boggy part of the site which has now improved public access and is part of ongoing efforts to improve James Cooke Wood where tree thinning has also been carried out to enhance the health and biodiversity of the woodland.
