### Pop-up stalls

Over the past several months Witham Town Councillors have been running pop - up stalls in various locations around Witham to bring awareness to a variety of

issues, and to give residents the opportunity to come and speak to them about anything they wish to discuss.

### **Essex Police Community Surgeries**

As you may recall from previous editions of the Voice, Essex Police have been holding community surgeries at Witham Town Hall on alternating Tuesdays



between 10-12 to give you a chance to pop in and speak to them about any concerns, to pass on any information or to ask any questions you may have.

### **Opposition to the National Grid**

We were recently informed that National Grid has plans to build a new 400,000 volts (400 kV) electricity overhead transmission line, work at existing substations and build a new substation to connect new proposed offshore wind farms to the electricity transmission network. They were running a public consultation to receive input from the community and Witham Town Council has submitted an objection to the plans.

We will be given another chance to comment next year before the planning permission is requested.
